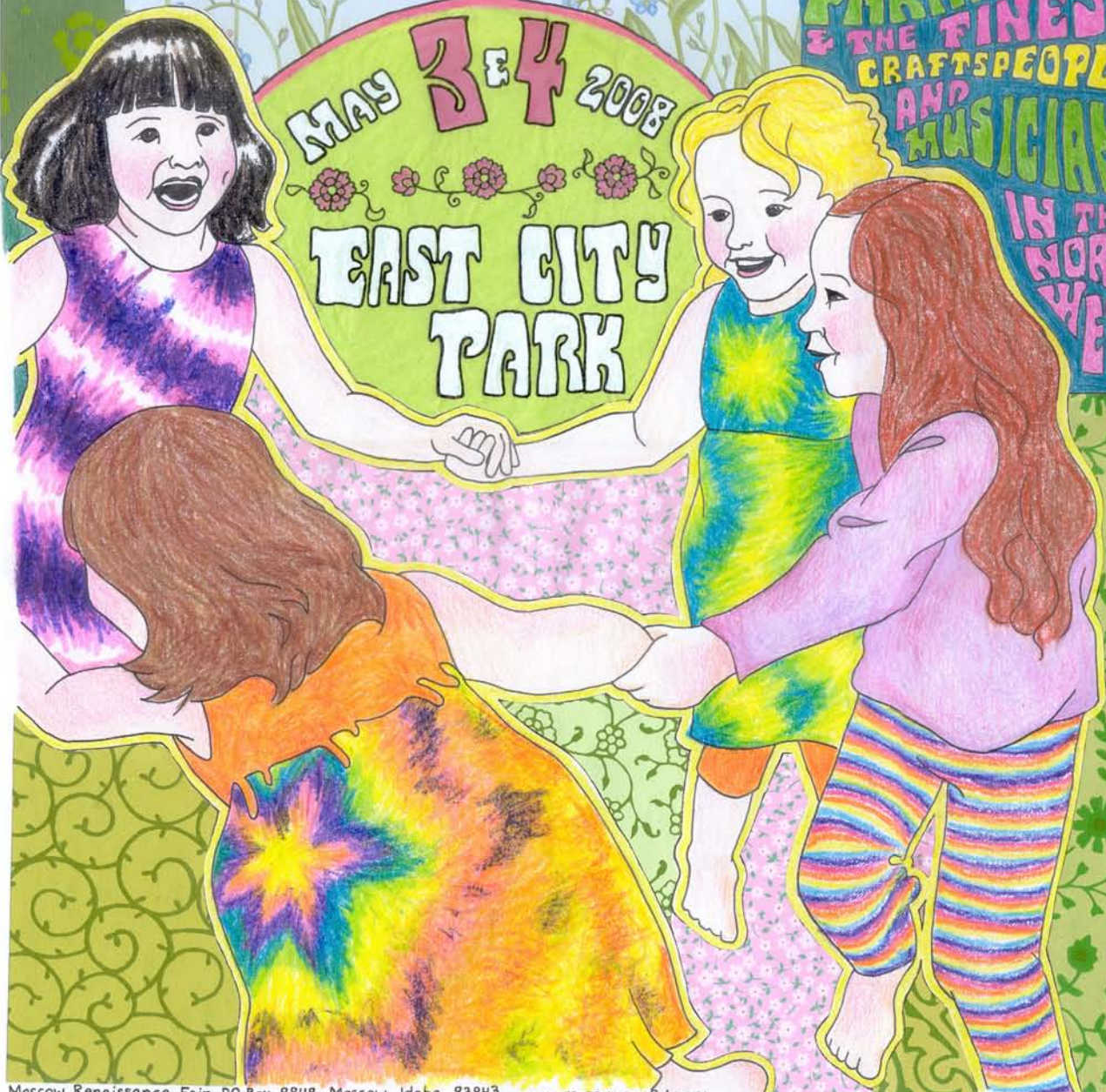

King & Queen Spotlight

Jim Prall and Lois Blackburn are the King and Queen of the 2008 Moscow Renaissance Fair. They were selected to honor their years of service to the community.

 **Jim Prall** moved, with his parents, to Moscow in 1951. He helped plan the first RenFair in 1973, and has been actively involved in the fair ever since, primarily as the keeper of the Maypole. The Maypole Dance, a traditional celebration of spring, includes winding long colorful streamers around the pole. Prall built, stored, and erected the Maypole for the fair every year since 1979 and is responsible for keeping that spring dance tradition alive in Moscow. In addition, he has served his community as a peace advocate and draft counselor, a member of the collective that created BookPeople, a hospice volunteer and board member, and an environmental activist.

 **Lois Blackburn** came to Moscow in 1991 as a professor of music at the UI. She retired in 1998 and continues as a private music teacher. Lois was the first president of the Moscow Civic Association, and has been actively involved in support of the Naylor Farms intervention, the Moscow Food Co-op, the Latah Human Rights Task Force, and the 1912 Center.

In a break from the RenFair tradition of selecting royalty linked by romantic or family ties, King Prall and Queen Blackburn were chosen for their singular accomplishments and matched together.

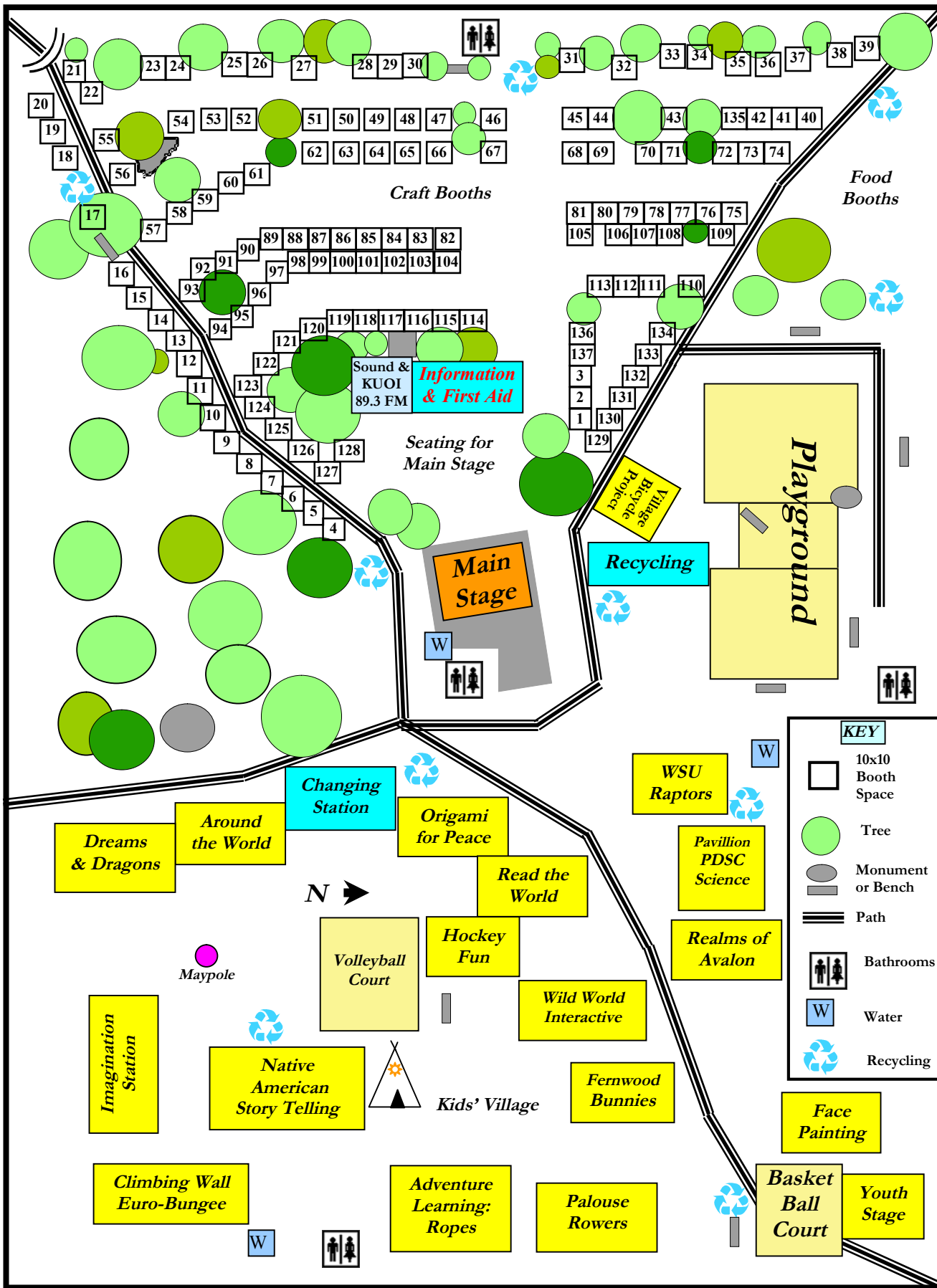
